Warli painting is one of Maharashtra's most iconic tribal art forms. Originating in Palghar, the Warli community has preserved this tradition by decorating mud walls during weddings, festivals, and harvests.

In 2014, Warli painting has been certified with Geographical Indication (GI) certification.

Palghar
